ROLES and RESPONSIBILITIES of the WORKPLACE PARTIES

BACKGROUD: Ever wonder how you can have a positive impact on workplace safety? We previously introduced the internal responsibility system (IRS) as the foundation of Ontario's health and safety laws. As part of the IRS <u>everyone in the workplace</u> has a role to play in making the workplace safe. Ontario's Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHS Act) details the specific duties (roles and responsibilities) of the workplace parties (re: sections 25-28). Below is a summary of those roles and responsibilities. For a detailed listing please refer to the OHS Act.

Employer Responsibilities

- Comply with the laws and orders issued by the Ministry of Labour
- Develop safety rules, program initiatives and policies and procedures
- Train all workers
- Manage and monitor hazards
- Provide safe equipment
- Take every precaution reasonable

Supervisor Responsibilities

- Train workers
- Manage hazards
- Ensure equipment is used safely and working conditions are maintained
- Enforce safety rules
- Take every precaution reasonable

Worker Responsibilities

- Report hazards, incidents and injuries to the supervisor
- Follow safe work procedures and rules
- Apply safety training
- Use the safety equipment provided properly
- Do not engage in horseplay
